## Christmas Appeal 2018

**A huge thank you to all the schools and parishioners who have supported our Christmas Appeal 2018. Your response has been amazing; it simply gets bigger and better each year!**

As Christmas drew nearer our van made journey after journey piled high to the roof collecting gifts, toys and food from schools and parishes, delivering them to our Head Office. From here in the week before Christmas, thanks to your generosity, our dedicated team made 340 toy and gift deliveries and 108 food hamper deliveries to children and families in need.

Financial donations towards our Crisis Fund amounted to £3234.00 which will enable us to offer support when it is most needed during 2019. It is amazing how far this fund can stretch.

All this is only possible as a result of the incredible generosity shown by schools and parishes across the Diocese. Thank you to all those who made Christmas 2018 so very special for so many children and families.



## Catholic Care Christmas Cracker Project

Catholic Care launched its Christmas Cracker Project in December 2018 as a way of supporting the most disadvantaged families across the Diocese who would have struggled with providing food for their families over the Christmas period.

More than 2,300 families in the Leeds area alone will have relied on the city's foodbanks to feed them at Christmas.

In addition to our Christmas Appeal, and following the success of our Holiday Hunger Project in the summer, working together with schools across the Diocese, we identified the most disadvantaged families and delivered 40 "Christmas Cracker Hampers". Each hamper contained a fresh chicken, a range of fresh vegetables as well as mince pies, chocolate treats and a box of Christmas crackers was also supplied to make Christmas dinner feel more special.

We received some fantastic feedback 'Thank you so much for this lovely hamper! It will make a big difference to our Christmas this year' said one mum.

## Catholic Care Supporting Refugees and Asylum Seekers

**Many of us continue to be moved by the plight of so many families and children forced out of their homes and countries through no fault of their own fleeing war and poverty, risking their lives and those of their children to find safety and sanctuary.**

Families arrive in the most tragic of circumstances, frightened, alone and traumatised.

### Refugee Response: How to help asylum seekers and refugees in 2019

On Tuesday 12 February the Parish of Our Lady of Lourdes & St William's (Parish of St. Blaise), Ingleby Road, Bradford, hosted another very successful meeting for the Diocesan Refugee Support Group.

The spacious parish hall was packed with nearly 100 people and at least 15 organisations that support refugees and asylum seekers in and around Bradford were represented. The opening presentation on Community Sponsorship for Refugees was presented by Sean Ryan MBE, National Caritas Community Sponsorship Coordinator and was followed by a series of shorter presentations, to give a flavour of the volunteering possibilities after which there was time for refreshments and plenty of conversation. As Carol Hill, Director of Catholic Care, said, "There was such a buzz around the room and people simply did not want to go home."



Just a few weeks ago Catholic Care's Gianna project started to support a family seeking safety; a pregnant mother and her two children who had witnessed the murder of their father and grandparents.

Later this pregnant mother was set alight and left to burn to death. She is here now in Yorkshire seeking kindness and help. All this is taking place in a climate of increasing hate crime and concerns around all forms of radicalisation, the services provided throughout the Diocese are needed more than ever.

### Bags of Dignity!

A huge thank you goes to the Parish Family of SS John Fisher and Thomas More Parish, Burley-in-Wharfedale, who had the novel idea of filling used handbags with toiletries, ladies' products and men's personal hygiene and shaving necessities for those in need.

Six bags have been given to Sheila Pickles from St Monica's Housing to give to the asylum seeking women in the House in Beeston; four bags have been retained for the new house in Harehills for the asylum seeking women who will be housed there. Carol Hill (Director of Catholic Care) made the final delivery of the remaining bags to St George's Crypt to support homeless men and women. Martin Patterson (Development Director at St George's Crypt) said "people often forget about specific ladies toiletries and the bags were very welcome". He thanked those who had donated.



## Community Sponsorship Update

**Community Sponsorship is where a community, may be a parish community or a local community, come together and welcome and support a Syrian refugee family.**

Community Sponsorship is now an increasing force across the country with over 150 groups in various stages of formation and many having welcomed their family.

In the Diocese of Leeds Community Sponsorship was launched in May last year and one parish to take up the challenge was SS Mary & Michael in Settle. The initial interest spread into the community and a group was formed. Paul Kelly has summarised their progress in an article entitled Refugee ReSETTLEMENT Community Sponsorship Group which can also be read in full on the news page of the Catholic Care website. The Group are well on their way and are now in the process of completing their formal application to the Home Office supported by Catholic Care who are undertaking the role of Lead Sponsor.

One of the pre-conditions of actually welcoming a family is that a fund of £9,000 is held to support the family for "emergencies" prior to them receiving benefits. Fund raising activities are in full swing in Settle including Chris Beesley, who is a member of the group, doing a sponsored run across the Three Peaks on a freezing cold January day. So far he has raised £1,700 which is excellent.
